



***Camp Koinonia*** (Coin-o-nia) - A residential camping program that strives to enhance the lives of children with disabilities.

*Camp Koinonia is a week-long residential, outdoor education program held once a year for over 100 children from East Tennessee who have multiple disabilities. The camp was founded in 1977 by Dr. Gene A. Hayes, professor at the University of Tennessee Department of Exercise, Sport, and Leisure Studies. The word Koinonia comes from the Greek language and means 'fellowship' and 'caring community'. The camp is held at the Clyde M. York, 4-H Training Center, a handicap accessible facility located in Crossville, Tennessee on a 194- acre beautiful, rustic location.*

*Camp Koinonia is supported by the efforts of The Camp Koinonia Foundation, a 501.C.3 not-for-profit corporation whose mission is to ensure community awareness for the organization within the East Tennessee region and position it for long term growth and preservation.*
